


OIF/OEF Veterans VA Health Care and Benefits


[PTSD Symptoms](#)

- Startle Reactions to noise or movement
- Reliving of traumatic memories
- Guilt or depression
- Concentration and memory problems
- Sleep Problems, dreams & nightmares
- Alcohol and/or substance abuse
- Authority Problems

Traumatic Brain Injury is a signature wound of the war in Iraq. If you were exposed to IED blasts, accidents, or other injury where you were dazed, confused, or lost consciousness and are currently experiencing any of the following symptoms you should give us a call or walk-in to our offices. We can screen you and refer you for further evaluation.

- Ringing in the ears
- Dizziness or Balance problems
- Irritability
- Memory Problems
- Sleep Problems
- Sensitivity to light/noise




